UP-CLOSE LOOK AT WIND TURBINES

A visit to a massive wind energy project near Buffalo draws comparisons — and many contrasts

BUFFALO, N.Y. — The High Sheldon Wind Project in upstate New York has been in operation for four years. But for nearly a decade before that the development was an uphill struggle for the elected leaders of a 200-year-old dairy farming community who envisioned a vast system of wind turbines near the shores of Lake Erie near Buffalo.

Town Administrator (read “mayor”) John Knab, 74, has a calm disposition that draws your attention, especially when the subject is his true passion—either antique farm equipment or wind energy.

“My wife says I could talk all day about Oliver tractors and the turbines,” Knab says with a clipped northern accent as he stands directly beneath one of the 300-foot-tall turbines—there are 75 in all—that dot the ridge slicing through his community.

Knab also has fortitude—more than most. Along the eight-year path to a prosperous wind turbine project in his township, Knab says he endured raucous public hearings, fear and misinformation, a handful of unsuccessful lawsuits and at least one death threat.

“Our regular meetings went from about two people to two hundred people,” Knab says. “I got really good at banging the gavel.”

Texas-based Pioneer Green Energy, which hopes to build two wind farms totaling around 55 turbines along Shinbone Ridge in Cherokee and Etowah counties, sanctioned the April 3-4 trip to western

New York in hopes of drawing a large group of local officials and decision makers so they could hear from a community that has already fought the battle that looms here.

In the end, only three participants from Gadsden joined two media representatives from Centre (including this

writer), to hear Knab and others from Sheldon talk about what effects the wind turbine farm has had on them and their neighbors.

A published history of the township commissioned after the wind turbines began spinning in spring 2009 explains that the plan faced opposition from the beginning.

“It was a bumpy road before the 75 turbines went up,” the booklet reads. “Some town residents were in favor of the plan, while others pointed to the danger it would bring to birds and bats, as well as what they considered to be an obstruction to the countryside’s beauty.”

Opponents in northeast Alabama also worry over the danger to wildlife and the prospect of diminishing of the beauty of Cherokee Rock Village, as well as the noise from the massive, spinning blades. (Standing

solution to the problem, those people are long and done.”

Kehl says the shadow flicker problem can be solved by window treatments or tree plantings, both offered by her company at no charge.

Declining property values in Cherokee County have also been mentioned as a concern if the Shinbone project proceeds, but Sheldon dairy farmer Jim Fontaine disagrees with that impression.

“I purchased 150 acres about three years ago that

directly beneath a turbine last week, the sound was most accurately likened to the swishing a pair of polyester pants makes while walking.)

Additional concerns include fear of a phenomenon called “shadow flicker” for residents whose homes lie along a path where the shadow of a turbine’s spinning blades would crawl past as the sun tracks across the sky.

“That’s about the only complaint we still hear,” says Mary Kehl, referring to the shadow effect. Kehl, a lifelong resident of Wyoming County who now works for the energy company that manages High Sheldon, adds, “Anyone who has called and wanted a reasonable

has two turbines on it, and if there had been a problem with property values I never would have purchased it,” Fontaine says. “As far as property values there is no negative impact.”

Other than the solidarity of those adamantly opposed to the idea of wind turbines, there are few direct comparisons to the High Sheldon project and those being proposed in northeast Alabama.

For example, in New York local communities have the authority to regulate themselves, unlike in Alabama where most laws must snake their way through the state Legislature. Those rowdy meetings Knab and his fellow elected officials

endured during the approval process, which lasted from 2001 to 2007, broke so many gavels because local elected officials were literally deciding the long-term future of their community with each vote.

A recent meeting of the Cherokee County Commission drew dozens of wind turbine opponents, but with only limited home rule powers the county's governing body has little control over what a private landowner wants to do on his own property.

Back in New York, 38 different land owners took in the High Sheldon project. And every resident ultimately benefitted from the project because annual royalty payments from Invenergy, the Chicago-based company that manages the turbines, total several hundred thousand dollars and have allowed the local leadership to suspend all town taxes.

If the Shinbone project is constructed in Cherokee County, all eight turbines will sit on property owned by one family, so the direct financial windfall will not be nearly as widespread. (A recent economic study conducted by Jacksonville State University estimates the Shinbone project will generate around \$300,000 annually in property taxes for Cherokee County, a little over half of which would go to the local school system.)

Another difference is that Invernegy developed the High Sheldon project from the beginning. Pioneer Green,

ostensibly, would construct the turbines in northeast Alabama and then sell the operation to an as-yet unknown energy company to operate for the next 20-30 years. That uncertainty creates concern for some local leaders.

Paul Kirsch says whatever uncertainty he might have had about wind energy is long gone. Kirsh is yet another Sheldon dairy farmer who also serves on the town council. His home sits within 2,500 feet of three wind turbines.

“The only time I look at them is to see which way the wind is blowing before I go out to spread manure,” Kirsch says with a smile. Of the wind turbine project, he says, “This is the best thing that has ever happened in Sheldon.”

Currently, Pioneer Green's proposed projects in Alabama are in stand-by mode, waiting for the results of several studies and final approval to proceed from the Tennessee Valley Authority. Even if those approvals come, the company will have to deal with a vocal, dedicated opposition to green energy technology along the pine-covered ridges of Cherokee County.

Officials from Pioneer Green will hold an open house for Cherokee County residents Saturday, April 13 from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. during the Chamber of Commerce's annual Home and Garden Show. Several officials from the company will be on hand to answer questions about the Shinbone Wind Project.

Region 7 champions.

Weeks 3: Hokes Bluff at



Coach Michael Shortt (113-59) enters his 16th year at Heflin. Make our children's safety a priority

The Bible says in Matthew 6:21, "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." I believe in the truth of that scripture, and over the next couple of months we will see where our state's leadership is putting their hearts.

As the Legislature returns for the second half of the 2013 session, one of its top priorities will be to finish the state budgets. There are several critical programs that our state needs to fund, such as Medicaid, public schools, and the courts. But one department that should be a top priority for us is the Department of Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention.

While there are several state funded and charitable programs that help families after neglect or abuse has occurred, the Department of Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention is Alabama's Only agency that tries to address the problem before it occurs.

The Department, created in 1983, established the Children's Trust Fund to "provide annual funding of community based prevention programs throughout the state as well as create a self-sustaining pool of funds to provide for funding these programs in the future."

This year, the Children's Trust Fund is funding approximately 86 community-based child abuse prevention programs across the state. These programs include traditional anti-abuse programs targeting children in K-12, as well as fatherhood programs, mentoring programs for new moms, and many other valuable programs.

But all of these programs are at risk because of the budget that was passed out of the state senate.

Fortunately, it is not too late to save these critical programs. The budget can be changed when the House of Representatives takes it up in the coming weeks, and I hope that my colleagues in the House will make it our first priority to restore funding for the Department of Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention as well as the Department of Children's Affairs, which lost all funding in the senate version of the budget.

Child abuse and neglect is a very real problem, and we cannot afford to ignore it. In 2010 alone, 9,586 children were victims of abuse or neglect in Alabama. That's about 8.5 out of every 1,000 children in Alabama. Of these children, 37.6 percent were neglected, 50.0 percent were physically abused, and 22.5 percent were sexually abused.

The problem hasn't gotten much better in recent years. According to the Child Welfare League of America, Alabama had 20,159 total referrals for child abuse and neglect since 2010. Of those, 19,900 reports were referred for investigation.

We cannot turn our backs on these children. Our children's safety, whether it is at school or at home, has to be our number one priority. If we cannot agree on that, then what in the world are we doing in Montgomery?

I encourage everyone who reads this to contact their local representatives and senators and ask them to support the Department of Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention and the Department of Children's Affairs. If we do not restore this funding, then we, too, are guilty of negligence. Making our children safer should be the Legislature's number one priority.

Anti-gun op-ed page

The NRA, which has five million members, supports the rights in the Constitution (unlike Mr. Rogers). The NRA is also the foremost proponent of gun safety training and has instructed more shooters (through NRA certified instructors, of which I have been one since 1973) in proper firearm handling than all other groups put together.

Ms. Hoffren's letter, though probably sincere and concerning, has let emotion overrule the facts. The proposed legislation she suggests makes good media fodder for the political left but will not achieve anything other than disarming law-abiding citizens while leaving the criminals with a free run. Since they ignore the laws banning robbing, murder and so forth, what makes you think that new gun laws will be followed any differently?

Ms. Hoffren's letter has to do with the true numbers involving so called "assault weapons" (a term the media loves to through around inaccurately). The facts

New limit placed on lawsuits

(AP) — The state Legislature passed a bill last week designed to make sure Alabama lands Airbus aircraft suppliers rather than its neighboring states. The Senate gave final approval to the bill 27-0 April 4 and sent it to the governor, who endorsed it and promised to sign it into law. The bill limits lawsuits against a plane's manufacturer and suppliers to causes of action arising within 12 years after a plane is delivered. Proponents said the time had been unlimited.

The bill is tailored for the new Airbus plant in Mobile because it applies only to commercial planes with at least 100 seats. Gov. Robert Bentley recruited Airbus last year with \$158 million in cash, tax breaks and other incentives.

Bentley said 3,700 more jobs could be created by companies supplying products to the plant. The governor visited Europe four months ago to talk to potential suppliers about locating plants in Alabama. After that visit, he said Mississippi and Florida had stricter litigation laws than Alabama, and they were using that to recruit suppliers because both states are near Mobile.

MONTGOMERY

Bill to subvert bid process dies

(AP) — An Alabama Senate committee blocked a bill last week that divided the state's construction industry by proposing a new way to construct public buildings without going through the traditional competition with sealed bids.

The Senate Commerce, Transportation and Utilities Committee agreed by a voice vote to carry over the bill indefinitely. "It's a dead bill," committee Chairman Gerald Allen, R-Tuscaloosa, said April 4.

The bill was pushed by the Alabama's Associated Builders and Contractors but was opposed by many members of Associated General Contractors of Alabama.

The bill would have allowed a government agency to pick a construction manager from qualified companies and then agree on a maximum price for a project. If the project came in over the maximum, the construction manager would have to pick up the extra cost, rather than the government entity. It also would have allowed a government entity to use the same company to design and supervise a construction project.

Urban farms try to meet local produce demands

BY SCOTT JOHNSON (AP) — Montgomery residents are hungry for locally grown food, and the operators of the city's urban farms are working to help feed that demand.

One way they are doing that is through a community supported agriculture program, or CSA, that delivers fresh, local produce in return for an upfront payment.

EAT South, the nonprofit that operates the downtown urban farm and the one at Hampstead in east Montgomery, is striving to educate the community about the virtues of locally grown food.

"You eat local and you have the freshest, tastiest most nutritious food you can possibly get right now in Montgomery," said Jetson Brown, manager of the urban farms.

Brown said he often hears from people who want to know where to find locally grown food.

"Some people don't even know it is possible to get local food," Brown said. "Some think it is extremely expensive, and some don't see the value of it."

The basic premise of CSAs is that a consumer pays upfront for an entire growing season and then once a week picks up food the farm has grown. That upfront payment helps pay farm expenses and is like buying a share in the farm, investing in the future yield of its crops.

By making the upfront payment, the consumer also is taking on some of the risk of the farmer if there is a bad season.

Red Root Farm in Banks, near Troy, is the only other farm that offers a CSA with food available for pickup in Montgomery.

Brown said there is easily enough demand for local produce to accommodate more farms offering CSAs in Montgomery.

Julie Johnson has taken

part in Red Root Farm's CSA and now is on board for the spring season with EAT South's program.

"You can't get this kind of quality in any grocery stores in Montgomery," Johnson said.

Johnson was picking up her first haul of produce for the spring season at the downtown farm. That first food pickup was held on the first day of spring, and pickups will continue every Wednesday for three months.

In the farm's first offering of the season, there were beets, turnips, green garlic, braising mix, microgreens and rosemary.

It was not a huge amount of food, but the offerings will expand as the season progresses, Brown said.

The upfront cost of the spring CSA was \$300 for 12 weeks, averaging out to \$25 a week.

Brown said consumers typically will receive about \$17 worth of food in the

early weeks and closer to \$40 worth of food in the later weeks.

The summer season is four months long, and the fall season last three months.

There currently is a short waiting list for the summer season, Brown said, but added there is always some turnover from season to season, so spots could open up.

Brown said he hopes to make the CSA available year-round by using a system for winter growing. He is looking at possibly using a "low-tunnel" method to protect crops during the winter.

Beyond its own CSA, EAT South members make sure to promote other local farms and encourage people to try out the farmers markets locations.

In Montgomery, there are farmers market locations on Eastchase Parkway, West Fairview Avenue, Madison Avenue and Federal Drive.

Bill to allow home brewing passes Alabama House

MONTGOMERY (AP) — The Alabama House on last week passed a hotly contested bill that could remove the state's distinction of being the only one in the nation prohibiting people from brewing beer at home.

The House voted 58-33 to approve the bill by Republican Rep. Mac McCutcheon. The bill passed the House last year, but died in the Senate.

When the Mississippi Legislature recently voted to legalize home brewing, the move left Alabama as the only state where the

procedure is illegal. Supporters argued that many in Alabama are already making their own beer.

Opponents urged House members to kill the bill, saying it would make it easier for children to gain access to beer. The bill now goes to the Senate for debate.

McCutcheon said it doesn't make sense for Alabama to restrict people from pursuing a hobby that 49 states allow.

A church-based group, the Alabama Citizen Action Program, is leading the opposition. Executive Director Joe Godfrey has said

allowing home brewing would let children see their parents making alcohol.

The Mississippi measure, signed by Gov. Phil Bryant, allows home brewers to make quite a lot of beer each year—100 gallons for households with one person who is over age 21 and 200 gallons if there are two or more people over 21.

That left Alabama alone in banning home brewing, according to the American Homebrewers Association. It estimates there are 1 million home brewers nationwide, with about 5,000 of them in

Alabama. That has happened even though Alabama law prohibits an individual from owning the equipment to make alcohol.

The state's liquor control agency, the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, has cracked down on the retail sale of home brewing equipment, but not on people who do it quietly in their homes. At least eight counties — Mobile, Montgomery, Jefferson, Madison, Tuscaloosa, Lee, Russell and Houston—have home brewing clubs that meet regularly.

Legally coping with Alzheimer's

The easiest way to manage a parent's affairs who has Alzheimer's, dementia, or some other mentally debilitating disease is for that parent to have previously signed a power of attorney when he or she had the legal mental capacity to do so. As I mentioned in an earlier article, power of attorney is a legal document in which one person authorizes another to act as an agent on his or her behalf. Financial powers of attorney allow your agent to make decisions regarding your property. Healthcare powers of attorney allow your agent to make decisions regarding your health care needs. Having a power of attorney in place that automatically comes into effect when you need it (a springing power of attorney) can be invaluable.

No one likes to think about needing such a document, or being unable to handle their own affairs. But as we age, the possibility becomes more likely. It is very important, and very easy, to prepare for this possibility by signing a

springing power of attorney while you have the proper legal mental capacity. A springing power of attorney saves your family from potentially having to obtain a guardianship and/or conservatorship over you through probate court, which is a more costly and less private undertaking.

After a parent or loved already has Alzheimer's or dementia, he or she usually doesn't have the legal mental capacity to execute a power of attorney. In these cases, a child seeking to legally take care of his or her parent usually has little choice but to try and obtain a legal guardianship and/or conservatorship over that parent.

A guardianship is a legal relationship where the probate court gives a person the power to make personal decisions for another. A family member or a friend can initiate the proceedings by filing a petition in the probate court in the county where the individual resides. First, a medical examination by a licensed physician is usually necessary to establish the

individual's condition. The probate court will then hold a hearing to determine 1) whether the ward is able to meet the essential requirements for his or her health and safety, and 2) whether the person applying for the guardianship is suitable. A guardian, however, does not have the legal authority to manage the ward's finances. If a child wants legal control over his parent's finances he also has to file a conservatorship with the probate court.

A conservatorship is a legal relationship whereby the probate court gives a person the power to make financial decisions for another. The court proceedings are very similar to those of a guardianship except the court determines whether an individual lacks the capacity to manage his or her financial affairs. If so, the court appoints a conservator to make monetary decisions for the individual.

Safety tips for seniors

Reduce risk, increase peace of mind when on the go this spring

BRANDPOINT — If you're just entering retirement, chances are you have many years of good health and independence ahead. But the normal aging process still brings limitations that we all need to prepare for - such as slower reaction times and declining vision - which can lead to accidents and injuries.

Many accidents are preventable though, and you can take simple measures to enhance your safety as you age.

In your home

Falls are one of the greatest age-related risks inside the home. One in three adults older than 65 falls each year, and the risk of injury rises with age, according to the National Safety Council. Many falls are caused by hazards that are easy to avoid if you know what to look for.

To prevent tripping, eliminate clutter on floors, remove throw rugs or tack them down with double-sided tape, and make sure electrical and phone cords are kept out of the way. You might need to rearrange some of your furniture as well, to ensure that there are unobstructed pathways into and out of every room.

In the bathroom, use a nonslip rubber mat or stick nonslip adhesive strips to the bottom of the bathtub or shower. You may also want to consider installing grab bars. Keep a night light on in the bathroom at night, and remove any obstacles in the path from the bedroom to the bathroom.

If your house has stairs, make sure they have good lighting (with light switches at both the top and bottom of the staircase) and sturdy handrails (preferably on both sides). Attaching nonslip rubber treads is a good idea if the steps are potentially slippery.

The kitchen presents a slightly different set of potential hazards. To reduce the risk that you'll cut or burn yourself, make sure there is bright, nonglare lighting over all food preparation areas. Also, it's better to store sharp knives in a knife block or rack rather than loose in a drawer. And make sure any hazardous substances (such as cleaning supplies) are well marked and stored in a place where they're unlikely to be misidentified or come in contact with food.

Outdoors

To make your yard safer, replace or repair any broken or loose paving stones and clear the walkways of overgrown branches or any other

potential tripping hazards. Make sure all handrails are firm and secure. Mark the edges of steps with reflective tape and check that there is enough light to see obstacles at night.

You might want to consider a timer or motion-detector light near the front door so

you don't have to fumble with your keys in the dark. And, just in case, make sure your house number is visible and lighted so emergency personnel can find it quickly.

In the car

To increase your safety on the road, have your vision and hearing checked every year, and, if you need them, wear your glasses or hearing aid when driving. Know your limitations and avoid situations that make you uncomfortable - for example, you may decide to avoid driving at night or on extremely busy roads.

Have your car checked regularly by a trusted mechanic to make sure it stays in good working order, and keep a cellphone with you so you're prepared in case of an emergency, which can't be emphasized enough. It's good to have a cellphone on hand for any type of emergency - not just in the car. In a 2011 survey by the Pew Research Center, 40 percent of respondents who owned cellphones said that in the past 30 days they had found themselves in an emergency situation in which having their phone with them helped.

Most accidents don't just happen. If you follow these simple safety tips, you'll decrease your risk of injury - and increase your chances of enjoying a long, happy retirement in the comfort of your own home.

Age-related macular degeneration

The primary treatment for age-related macular degeneration, a chronic eye condition that causes vision loss, is effective even if patients have macular traction problems, a Mayo Clinic study shows.

Due to the aging populations, an increasing number of patients are being treated for age-related macular degeneration (AMD), an eye condition in which abnormal blood vessels develop and leak into the eye. When patients develop wet AMD, they receive injections of anti-vascular endothelial growth factor medication (VEGF). VEGF prompts growth of new blood vessels in the body. In the case of AMD, however, such new growth is unwanted and may cause bleeding in the retina.

It has not been clear whether this treatment would also serve patients experiencing other symptoms, such as vitreomacular interface disease (VMID), in which there is traction or contact between the retina and the vitreous matter in the eye. Mayo researchers retrospectively studied 178 patients, of whom 18 percent had VMID over an average of 2.5 years.

Finding showed that while eyes with some kind of macular traction required more injections, they still showed improvement (best corrected visual acuity) similar to eyes without VMID. The finding is significant because it showed that patients with VMID are not necessarily treatment-resistant for AMD. It may help physicians not give up on treating such patients, and understand the need for more doses of medication for those with VMID. Researchers say more study is needed, including a prospective clinical trial.

A new experimental drug (ORM-12741) is showing promising results as a new medication to help reduce memory loss among individuals struggling with moderate Alzheimer's disease. A three month clinical trial was conducted involving 100 individuals diagnosed with Alzheimer's. By the end of the study, individuals who took the new medication showed improvement on the tests of their memory. Scores decreased by 33 percent among the 50 individuals who were given a dummy pill rather than the new medication. Test scores highlighted an apparent memory benefit, without prompting severe side effects.

Alzheimer's disease (AD) is the most common form of dementia. It is a progressive brain disease that robs people of their memory and the ability to perform even simple everyday tasks. Current available medications aim at controlling its debilitating symptoms. ORM-12741 is the first medication to target and activate a specific receptor in the brain, called alpha-2C. This receptor is thought to play a role in the brain's response to fight stress that can trigger dementia.

Ask The Pet Doctors

Help! There are feet coming out of my cow!

One of the most frustrating and heartbreaking sights for a cattle producer is to drive out in the pasture in the morning to find a cow down trying to have a calf. Considerable money has gone into getting her to this point: the work of getting her bred, feeding her to grow the baby, it is finally time for it to hit the ground and all you see is feet. It is most important to monitor her to see if she is delivering normally. Some cows may take several hours to deliver; however I have even seen some older cows continue to eat hay while she delivers. Here are some helpful tips to manage this difficult situation:

- 1) Monitor from a distance, especially if your cattle are not used to you walking around them. If you get too close to an animal in labor, they can shut down their labor and refuse to give birth because they fear their young will be in danger—think of it like you are a coyote on the prowl.
- 2) Have a catch facility or a small pen you can bring her into if you think that she is having problems. It is a lot more efficient to deliver the calf in a sturdy facility than chasing her through a pine forest.
- 3) Have obstetrical kit on the farm before calving season. You do not have time to run to town if she truly is in trouble. A small tool box is the perfect container for supplies. Common supplies needed are obstetrical sleeves and lube, obstetrical handles and chains, and possibly a head snare. Another good tool is a clean bucket—not an old oil bucket full of nails but one you have set aside for this purpose—and some Betadine solution to clean her up.
- 4) Intervene early if possible. If you recognize she is having problems, the time to act is now if you want to save the calf. Restrain her with a halter if possible. Using sleeves and lube and being as clean as possible, go in vaginally and see how the calf is positioned. A normal calf can come with front feet and head first with his belly facing the ground or can come rear legs first with belly facing the ground. Any other position is considered abnormal.
- 5) Never hook the end of the chains up to the calf and the other end to a wench on your truck, tractor or tree. Sometimes, simple manipulation such as pulling the retained leg forward and a good strong pull with your hands is all that is needed. If you are unable to pull with you and one other person, immediately call your veterinarian for assistance.
